


SPRING NATURE FINDINGS

- A tree that is younger than you

- Something smooth that would fit in this circle
- Something rough that would fit in this circle
- Something soft that would fit in this circle
- Something flying, floating, or falling
- A white flower in bloom
- Something that you've never seen before
- Something that smells good
- Something that smells stinky
- A smell you've never smelled before
- A fern growing in a tree
- Three different colors (besides green)
- A leaf with rough edges
