On a tight budget and looking for some penny-pinching recreation ideas this summer?

- Visit your local park. We offer more than 200 park sites, many with play equipment and picnic tables.
- Go for a walk, jog or bike ride on a local trail. THPRD offers 60 miles of trails, most of them paved.
- Explore a natural area. There are 1,300 acres of natural areas within Park District territory. Two favorites are the Cooper Mountain Nature Park in Aloha (opened in June 2009) and the Tualatin Hills Nature Park off Millikan Way near downtown Beaverton. The latter is heavily wooded – a great place to escape summer’s heat.

So get out and enjoy any of these venues this summer. Admission to all THPRD parks, trails and natural areas is free.

Chief among them is the 32-acre THPRD/PCC Rock Creek Recreation Facility. This complex includes two synthetic turf soccer/lacrosse/football fields; four sand-based baseball/softball fields; two natural turf practice fields and six tennis courts.

THPRD also provides a multi-sport complex in partnership with the Tualatin Valley Water District; softball and baseball fields at the Sunset Park Sports Complex; and a soccer field complex at Rock Creek Powerline Park.
